These camps provide youth with hands on learning experiences and improved access to education pathways.

Long term, the initiative has the potential to inject future talent into the regional workforce.








Damien's Journey

#### 2021

Youth Academy delivered first official full summer schedule, with 241 participants and four new educational camps piloted on the Comox Valley campus.

#### 2022

Sections offered nearly doubled.
Participation increased to 332. Three new camps were piloted on the Comox Valley campus, including a new program for ages 9-12. Two camps were expanded to the Campbell River campus for the first time.





#### **INCREASED ACCESS**

Create access for all youth, including under-represented and underserved groups.

- Expand summer camp programming to Campbell River, Port Alberni and Port Hardy campuses.
- Listen to Indigenous, community and school district partners to learn about community needs.

#### WORKSHOPS

Deliver special interest workshops and leadership activities for youth ages 13-16.

- Connect youth with faculty through workshop style sessions.
- Highlight education pathways and career opportunities.

#### **OVERNIGHT CAMPS**

Host overnight camps in NIC student housing in the Comox Valley.

 Showcase the exceptional facilities on campus and what the region has to offer.
